Baby Animals in Spring

After the cold winter there are flowers in the gardens, blossoms¹ on the trees and new animals in the fields². Animals have babies in the spring because there is lots of food and the weather is not very cold.

Lambs*

A baby sheep is called a lamb. You can see them playing in the fields. In English we call this playing "gambolling" (= skotačení).

Kittens

A baby rabbit is called a kitten or sometimes a bunny. Baby cats are also called kittens.

Calves*

A baby cow is called a calf. Calves can walk when they are born and drink their mum's milk.

Chicks³

A chick is a baby bird. **Hens**⁴ can have more than ten chicks! Other birds make a **nest**⁵ in a tree for their chicks. **Cuckoos**⁶ do not make a nest. They put their eggs in other birds' nests.
