FEEL THE OLYMPIC SPILLT

This year is the 120<sup>th</sup> **anniversary**<sup>2</sup> of the first modern Olympic games, which took place • in Athens in 1896. Only 14 countries took part in • those games. Today the games are much bigger. This year, more than 10,000 athletes ['æθliːt] from about 200 countries took part.

But the first ancient (= starověký) Olympic games were much earlier, about 3,000 years ago. They took place in Olympia, Greece around 776 BCE\*. They were a part of a festival for Zeus, the king of the Greek gods.

The film Eddie the Eagle (2016) tells the story

of British skier Eddie Edwards. He was a true Olympic **hero**<sup>8</sup>. He was the worst skier in

Olympic history, but he truly **believed**<sup>9</sup> the Olympic creed: "The most important thing is

And that is only the summer games. The winter games are for sports on ice and snow, and the Paralympic games (both winter and summer) are for athletes with **disabilities**<sup>3</sup>.

There are also **Youth**<sup>4</sup> Olympic games for young people aged 14 to 18. These started in 2010, but they are growing fast. Some winners from the last youth games **competed**<sup>5</sup> in Rio (for example, the young Brazilian **archer**<sup>6</sup> Marcus D'Almeida).

## THE RINGS AND THE FLAME<sup>10</sup>

The most famous symbol of the games is the Olympic flame. A woman lights the flame in Olympia (home of the original Greek Olympics) using the sun's energy. People carry the flame from Greece to the **host nation**" of the Olympics. It then travels around the country.

Another famous Olympic symbol is the five circles. Each circle represents one of the five continents. The Olympic motto is Citius, Altius, Fortius: faster, higher, stronger.
